<u>POINT</u>: To this point in Romans, the Apostle Paul has logically set forth God's plan of redemption for sinful mankind (Chapters 1-3); he has clearly presented the doctrine of justification (Chapters 4, 5); followed by that of sanctification (Chapters 6, 7); and the certainty of glorification for every believer (Chapter 8); moreover, he has answered questions relative to the hardness/blindness of Israel by demonstrating that it is partial and temporal, for God has yet to bring in the fullness of Israel (Chapters 9-11).

He now pours forth in vs. 33-36 one of the most sublime and moving tributes to God in all of the Bible.
